Lester Strong to speak to prospective Cambridge College students

CAMBRIDGE— Cambridge College has invited a former Boston television personality to meet interested new students. Lester Strong, Chief Development Officer at BELL Foundation and former WHDH Channel 7 news anchor will speak to prospective Cambridge College students on **Thursday, January 11th at 6 p.m. at 80 Prospect Street, Cambridge.**

Cambridge College will offer an information session in order to promote its undergraduate and graduate programs to adults interested in a college degree. Following the information session, Mr. Strong will give a presentation in which he will address civil rights and education.

Mr. Lester is well-known in Boston as a former television news anchor and medical editor for WHDH-TV. During his time at WHDH, Lester won an EMMY award for his coverage of gang violence, was recognized as the Most Outstanding Health Journalist in Massachusetts, and won the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Cancer Society. Lester Strong has served as the Chief Development Officer at BELL since April 2005.
