Cambridge College opens new building in Cambridge to house School of Management

CAMBRIDGE— Cambridge College is growing. On Monday, October 15th the Cambridge College School of Management will officially move to its new location at 17 Monsignor O'Brien Highway in Cambridge. The offices of the faculty and staff of the School of Management will transition to the new location today, while the School of Management classes will move to the building effective November 1st.

“Cambridge College is committed to providing our schools and students with state of the art facilities,” said Jennifer J. Tonneson, Vice President of Finance, Administration and Student Services. “With the success of the School of Management, we are thrilled that we were able to find and refurbish this location. The excitement and development around East Cambridge is something we are proud to be a part of.”

The building at 17 Monsignor O'Brien is a four-story brick office building located across the street from the Museum of Science. All four floors have been remodeled to include state of the art offices, classrooms and student spaces. This location features 13 new classrooms, informal meeting areas, and room for 30 staff and faculty members. Renovations to the building were designed by Symmes Maini & McKee Associates of Cambridge and construction done by Chapman Construction of Newton.

This will be Cambridge College's fourth location in the city: the College owns the building at 1000 Massachusetts Avenue and rents space at 80 Prospect Street and 315 Broadway.
