Cambridge College Hosts Digital Literacy Symposium

CAMBRIDGE— Cambridge College is in the forefront of blending technology and education. On Monday, October 29th, the Cambridge College Center for Adaptive Learning and Programs (CALP) will host a technology symposium, “The Access, Success and Impact of AdaptNet Programs,” from **4-6:30 p.m. in Room 152 at 1000 Massachusetts Avenue in Cambridge.**

This event will present the current success and future direction of both the AdaptNet Master of Management program and the Digital Literacy Project at Cambridge College. “Online education today is becoming the norm rather than the exception,” said Dr. Nish Sonwalkar, Vice President and Associate Dean of CALP. “The AdaptNet programs combine the best of online education with the best of classroom teaching, blended with the Cambridge College teaching and learning model.”

Since Cambridge College introduced its first Adaptive Blended Learning program in February 2005, CALP has deployed several cohorts of students for graduate education and workforce development. The symposium will serve as a forum for discussion about early results, lessons learned and future plans regarding online education and adaptive learning.
