**Cambridge College Professor Cellastine Bailey to be honored as a
2007 Woman of Distinction**

CAMBRIDGE— A Cambridge College professor is being recognized for her outstanding contributions to Education. Dr. Cellastine P. Bailey, a Cambridge College Education professor and a teacher in the Springfield Public Schools, is being honored by the Girl Scouts of Pioneer Valley at the 2007 Women of Distinction Dinner on March 8, 2007 at 5:30 p.m. at The Log Cabin in Holyoke, MA.

“This award means a great deal to me,” says Dr. Bailey. “I am honored to have been selected by the Girl Scouts. Teaching and learning are the heart and soul of my career. Often new teachers are left to learn ‘how to teach’ on the job. My experiences at Cambridge College allow me not only to teach, but to share my experiences as a veteran teacher.”
