**Cambridge College to Install Dr. Tito Guerrero as President**

**CAMBRIDGE, MA**— The Board of Trustees of Cambridge College will install Dr. Tito Guerrero, III as the third President of Cambridge College on **Friday, May 29<sup>th</sup> at 6 p.m. in Room 152 of the College's main campus at 1000 Massachusetts Avenue, Cambridge, MA.**

Dr. Guerrero was most recently the Vice President and Associate Provost for Diversity at Texas A&M University. Dr. Guerrero previously served as President of Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas, as well as President of the University of Southern Colorado. He began his tenure at Cambridge College on March 1, 2009.

"I am pleased and honored to have been chosen to lead such an important institution with such an ambitious mission," said Dr. Guerrero. "In the current economic climate, Cambridge College is needed now more than ever, and is essential to improving and strengthening our students and the communities in which they live and work. As President, I will ensure that the College continues this important work during a time when our community needs us the most."

Jonathan Z. Larsen, Chair of the College's Board of Trustees, expressed his pleasure with the College's choice. "We are delighted to welcome Dr. Guerrero to Cambridge College," he said. "He is a visionary leader with a stellar national reputation and a wealth of diverse academic experience."

He has served as a Director for the American Council on Education, American Association of State Colleges & Universities, the Hispanic Association of Colleges & Universities, and American Humanics, Inc. He received the Harvard Alumni of Color Achievement Award in 2007 and was selected among the 100 Most Influential Hispanics in the United States by *Hispanic Business* Magazine in 2006.
