**Cambridge College to Offer Master of Management Degree  
at Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital**

**CAMBRIDGE**—Cambridge College is doing its part to keep Boston healthy. Cambridge College and Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital have joined to offer the College’s unique Health Care Management graduate degree program at the hospital, beginning this month.

“The partnership with Spaulding Rehab Hospital is a great addition to our established instructional sites in hospitals in the metro-Boston area,” said John Bove, Assistant Dean and Director of the Health Care Management program. “This now allows interested Cambridge College health care students access and opportunity to earn an advanced degree in your own backyard.”

Cambridge College’s Master of Management in Health Care Management is specifically designed for working adults. Classes will be held on Thursday evenings with additional classes available on the weekends at Spaulding Rehab at 125 Nashua Street in Boston. Courses will also be offered at Massachusetts General Hospital and Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary, both of which are within walking distance of Spaulding. The program is open to Spaulding employees as well as other experienced health care professionals working in the area.

The Cambridge College Health Care Management program provides the education needed to meet current and future challenges faced by health care managers and team members. Health care is viewed from a systems perspective as a totality of structure, process and outcome, and from a multi-cultural perspective. The objectives of the program include enhancing management skills by blending theory and practice, and applying those skills with a problem solving orientation; increasing awareness of social and environmental influences on health care delivery including racial, ethnic and economic factors in health disparities; and understanding health care issues, practices and systems in historical, national and international context.

Health Care Management is one of Cambridge College's fastest growing programs. The College offers the degree program in partnership with hospitals throughout Massachusetts including Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston Medical Center, Mass Eye and Ear Infirmary, Cambridge Health Alliance, Jordan Hospital, Newton Wellesley Hospital, Lawrence General Hospital and most recently Cape Cod Health Care.
