



Scholarships Offered at Cambridge College Academic Year 2007-2008

GENERAL CRITERIA: Must be able to demonstrate financial need.

Alice S. Ayling Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in an undergraduate degree program.

This scholarship supports promising men and women who could not otherwise afford a college education. This scholarship, once awarded, is available to the student as long as he or she is making steady academic progress toward the completion of a degree program.

Charles Irwin Travelli Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in an undergraduate degree program.

The Charles Irwin Travelli Fund was created in 1958 to support promising men and women who could not otherwise afford a college education. This scholarship, once awarded to a student, is available to the student as long as she or he is making good and steady academic progress toward completion of the undergraduate degree.

Chandler Steiner Humanities Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in the undergraduate Humanities degree program.

This scholarship is awarded to qualifying students enrolled in the Humanities program.

Foundation in Honor of Elizabeth J. McCormack

Criteria: Must be a paraprofessional working in the Boston Public Schools, taking classes at the Cambridge campus, enrolled in an undergraduate degree program studying to become a teacher.

This scholarship provides assistance to adult learners in need of financial assistance who are paraprofessionals in the Boston Public Schools studying to become teachers.

Eileen Moran Brown Scholarship Endowment Fund

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree seeking program.

This fund honors Eileen Brown's leadership and celebrates her appointment as the first Chancellor of Cambridge College.

Foundation in Honor of Eileen Moran Brown

Criteria: Must have been/be a paraprofessional working in the Boston Public Schools, taking classes at the Cambridge campus, enrolled in a Master's degree program studying to become a teacher.

This scholarship provides assistance to adult learners in need of financial assistance who are paraprofessionals in the Boston Public Schools studying to become teachers.

Mary E. Moran Scholarship Endowment Fund

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree seeking program.

This fund provides “first dollar” and “last dollar” financial assistance to needy students.

Susan Lowell Wales Dineen Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree seeking program.

This scholarship provides support to alleviate the financial burden of returning to school.

William Randolph Hearst Endowed Scholarship Fund

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree seeking program and demonstrate steady academic progress.

This endowment fund provides financial assistance to adult learners with demonstrated motivation and financial need.

Dorot Foundation

Criteria: Must be able to demonstrate financial need.

These scholarships are awarded on an annual basis to qualifying students in need of financial assistance.

Frederick E. Weber Charities Corporation

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree program.

These scholarships are awarded to qualifying students in need of financial assistance.

The Lillian and Mack Kander Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree seeking program.

Virginia Wellington Cabot Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in the Medical Interpreter’s Training program.

This scholarship provides support to bilingual, low-income students who are enrolled in the Medical Interpreter Training Program.

The Sheila Gamble Fund Scholarships

Criteria: Must be enrolled in the Medical Interpreter’s Training program and be a resident of the Greater Boston area.

These scholarships are for bilingual students in the Medical Interpreter’s Training Program who are working to improve the quality of life for the immigrant community in the local area.

Henry Francis Barrows Scholarship Fund

Criteria: Must be a Protestant male, enrolled in a degree seeking program, have attended or graduated from a Boston or Greater Boston Public High School.

This scholarship program provides scholarships for Protestant men in institutions of higher learning who have attended Boston public high schools or other public high schools in the greater Boston area which includes: Cambridge, Chelsea, Everett, Quincy, Revere, Somerville.

Henry Hampton Scholarship

Criteria: Must be able to demonstrate in your personal or professional work the tenets of civil rights for all groups and individual, be enrolled in a degree seeking program.

These scholarships are awarded to students (particularly African American students) who demonstrate in their personal and professional work the tenets of civil rights for all groups and individuals.

The White Fund

Criteria: Must be a resident of Lawrence or live in the greater Merrimack Valley.

This scholarship provides assistance for adult learners who are residents of Lawrence and the greater Merrimack Valley.

The Anne W. Hiatt Scholarship Endowment Fund

Criteria: Must be Southeast Asian, must be enrolled in a degree seeking program.

Hiatt Scholarships are awarded to Cambridge College students from the Southeast Asian nations of Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, and Burma who demonstrate outstanding dedication to achieving their educational goals—and to creating a better society.

Stacey Milgrim Scholarship

Criteria: Must be enrolled in a degree seeking program, attempting to make a life or career change through education, handling difficult family problems.

The Scholarship is intended to support women and men who are attempting to make a life or career change through education, and who are also handling difficult family problems as they complete their educational program.

Jane Saltonstall Scholarship

Criteria: Must be women enrolled in a degree seeking program, have experienced and overcome extraordinary personal challenges.

This scholarship supports women who are making steady progress toward the completion of a Bachelor's or Master's degree and who have experienced and overcome extraordinary personal challenges in their lives.

Jay Veevers Scholarship

Criteria: Must be a single mother, enrolled in a degree program and be able to demonstrate financial need.

Provides assistance to single mothers to alleviate the financial burden of returning to school.

St. Mary's Women and Children's Center Frances A. Keith Scholarship

Criteria: Scholarship candidates are identified by St. Mary's Women and Children's Center. Students must be enrolled in a degree program.

This fund provides scholarships to students who demonstrate financial need entering Cambridge College who are or were a client, resident, student or a child of a client, resident or student or an employee of Caritas St. Mary's Women and Children's Center, Inc.

The Tudor Foundation Scholarship for constituents of Mother Caroline Academy

Criteria: Scholarship candidates are identified by Mother Caroline Academy Staff.

Students must be enrolled in a degree program.

This fund provides scholarships to students who demonstrate financial need entering Cambridge College who are a parent of student attending the Academy, a volunteer of the Academy, a student of a community program of the Academy.

James and Kim Pallotta Scholarship

Criteria: These candidates are identified by Year Up. Cambridge College does not accept applications for this scholarship.

These scholarships are awarded to graduates of the Year Up program who wish to continue their education at Cambridge College. The scholarship provides scholarship for up to four classes. Classes must be taken within one year from the date of award.

1) Write an essay stating **why you would like to continue your education/what it means to you to further your education at Cambridge College**. This essay should be at least 500 words (1.5 to 2 pages). 2) Recipients of Pallotta scholarship must have a good academic record with Year Up. 3) Students must complete Cambridge College Admissions and Financial Aid (FAFSA) files. 4) Interview with Year Up's Pallotta Scholarship Committee made up of Director of Career and Alumni Services, Site Leaders, and Director of Enrollment (Liaison with Cambridge College). 5) Final decision for scholarship recipients will be made by Year Up Committee. When are scholarships awarded?

For the 2007 – 2008 Academic Year, the Scholarship Committee will have three award cycles.

Fall semester – awards will be made in October

Spring semester – awards will be in February

Summer semester – awards will be made in June

How will I be notified if I qualify?

You will receive a letter from the Director of Financial Aid.

What happens if I get turned down?

You may re-apply for funds the following semester.
