Traditional library arrangements for Virginia students:

As a regionally accredited institution of higher education it is important that students of Cambridge College have access to library resources for use in preparation of class assignments as well as for general research purposes. To properly prepare our students, Cambridge College—Chesapeake Branch—wants you to be aware of the following library services and resources that are available to you:

For online and traditional library and research skills instruction: See your seminar advisor.

Old Dominion University Library (Norfolk) <http://www.lib.odu.edu/>

As a resident of Virginia all enrolled students are privileged to use the library facilities of any state supported institution, including Old Dominion University. Cambridge College will reimburse you for the cost of a card:

- Purchase a "Friends of the Old Dominion University Library" card for \$35/year
- See the office manager at Cambridge College for reimbursement upon submittal of paid receipt

Norfolk State University Library (Norfolk) <http://spartan270.nsu.edu/>

As a resident of Virginia all enrolled students are privileged to use the library facilities of any state supported institution, including Norfolk State University.

- Present proof of residency to the Norfolk State University Lyman Beecher Brooks Library, at which time a "community card" will be issued at no charge

All patrons of The Library of Virginia must register to use books from our closed stacks. Residents of Virginia, 18 years and over, may borrow circulating library materials. Photo identification, proof of residence and current address are required.

State employees may request research assistance in person, by telephone, by fax, or through the Research Request Form for State Employees.

Residents of Virginia and particularly the Richmond area may ask the Interlibrary Loan Department to request, from another library, materials not owned by the Library of Virginia. There is no cost for this service other than what some lending libraries may charge to fill the request. Libraries that do not charge are contacted first. You must visit the Library for this service. You may fill out the Interlibrary Loan Request Form (pdf) before you visit the library.

Provides library service 24 hours a day at home, at work, or anywhere you connect to the internet.

You can find magazine and newspaper articles, encyclopedias and other reference works, TV and radio transcripts, company information and investment reports, health and wellness information, and homework help, plus photos, charts, maps, diagrams, and illustrations.

A Virginia public library card is the only requirement to use these resources.
