

**For Ed.D. Students at Cambridge College:
Use of Gutman Library at Harvard Graduate School of Education**

What is Gutman Library?

Gutman Library of the Harvard Graduate School of Education covers education in the US and other English-speaking countries. Collections include ERIC microfiche and historical textbooks. Primary focuses are educational administration and policy, elementary and secondary education, teachers and teaching, educational innovations, educational psychology, human development, language acquisition, and the history of education. These collections are searchable in the HOLLIS Catalog and supplemented by electronic resources on the [Harvard Libraries](http://www.harvard.edu/libraries) Web site. The collection of circulating books and non-circulating periodicals totals approximately 198,000 volumes. Gutman currently subscribes to about 1,300 journals.

The catalog of the Gutman Library for Harvard libraries is called the HOLLIS Catalog at <http://holliscatalog.harvard.edu>

NOTE: The HOLLIS catalog citation must say that the book is in Gutman Library, because Gutman Library cannot provide materials from any other Harvard library or any other library; however it can recall Gutman books checked out to other borrowers.

What does Gutman Library provide for Cambridge College students?

- Cambridge College students have access to the complete collections and reference services at Gutman Library, including use of databases in the library.
- With a "Special Borrower" card, Cambridge College students can borrow materials from Gutman Library
- Individual consultations with reference librarians can be arranged by appointment by calling the Reference Librarians at 617-491-3421/3422

What education-related databases does Gutman Library have that are not in Cambridge College Online Library?

NOTE: you can only use these databases in Gutman Library using Gutman's computers. You cannot access them online.

- Full-text of Digital Dissertations. Cambridge College Online Library provides Digital Dissertations Index only. You can make a PDF file of a full-text dissertation at Gutman Library instead of having to buy it at your own expense

What about the ERIC collection at Gutman?

ERIC (Education Resource Information Center) is a huge collection of research materials in education. For more information about ERIC and about ERIC in CCOL, please see the handout "Search ERIC for Education and Counseling" at <http://www.cambridgecollege.edu/library/research.cfm>

The advantage of using ERIC at Gutman is that their microfiche collection provides full-text of ERIC documents earlier than 1993 (the CCOL online collection starts at 1993). It also has full-text documents after 1993 which are not online due to copyright issues. The disadvantage of viewing documents on microfiche is that it can be costly to copy pages, so find as much online as you can.

Where is Gutman Library?

Gutman Library is 1.5 miles from Cambridge College's building at 80 Prospect Street, but only a few blocks from the Harvard Square subway station on the Red Line to Alewife. Take the subway to Harvard Square, get off at Church Street exit, go down Church Street, passing the movies, to where it ends at Brattle Street. Turn right and walk a block to the corner of Brattle and Appian Way. The entrance is on Appian Way, around the corner. You can't see it from Brattle Street. It is very difficult to drive or park in Harvard Square. (There isn't much inexpensive food near Gutman, except for right by the subway.)

What do Cambridge College Students need to enter Gutman Library?

You must present your Cambridge College or Cambridge College/NITE ID card.

What do Cambridge College Students need in order to borrow books or other materials from Gutman Library?

You must have a Gutman Library "Special Borrower" card. You must be a registered student to do the following:

- Log into MyCC
- Click the Academics tab in the upper part of your screen
- Click "Cambridge College Online Library" from the column on the left
- Fill out the online "Gutman Library Student Borrower Card Application"

How to you pay for copying at Gutman Library?

To use the copiers without cash, you must get a Crimson Card, which is a debit card issued by Harvard that the copying machines will recognize. You do not have to be a Harvard student to buy a card.

You must buy an initial \$1 card and then you can add more value to it online. To buy the initial \$1 card, go to the Crimson Cash Office in the Harvard Dining Services building at 65 Winthrop Street in Harvard Square. Their hours are 9-4:30 M-F. One person can buy as many \$1 cards as they wish, so you can save your friends a trip by sending one person to buy them all.

Cards can also be purchased from machines at several sites on the Harvard campus, but some of these machines may be in buildings you cannot enter without Harvard ID. For further information, go to www.cash.harvard.edu

The library focuses on educational administration and policy, elementary and secondary education, teachers and teaching, educational innovations, educational psychology, human development, language acquisition, history of education, and selected subject areas related to education in the US and other English-speaking countries. Collections include ERIC microfiche, historical textbooks, and the Action for Children's Television Collection

Gutman Library is open to all members of the Harvard University Community and to Gutman Special Borrowers, including Cambridge College faculty and students. To access the library, you must show a current Cambridge College or NITE ID card.

You cannot take books or other materials out of Gutman Library unless you have applied for and received a Gutman "Special Borrower" card, which can take up to one month to process. Apply online in your MyCC "Academics" tab.

Gutman Library cannot provide materials from any other Harvard library or any other library; however it can recall Gutman books checked out to other borrowers

Harvard research databases cannot be accessed remotely by outside users but they can be accessed from any computer in Gutman Library

Cambridge College students can get wireless access at Gutman. It is an unsecured network for guests, but it works well. However, to use the Harvard library subscription resources requires one of the hard-wired library PCs.

Students or faculty can call Gutman Library Research Services Department at (617) 495-3421/3422 to make an individual research consultation appointment with a librarian to develop a research strategy, identify resources, or work on any research-related question. Those who call first will be scheduled first, until the schedule is filled

In Gutman Library, Cambridge College students will get help in using Harvard University resources only. Gutman staff cannot help with Cambridge College resources such as CCOL. They do not do writing instruction. All non-Harvard resources questions and/or need for technical/computer/writing assistance should be taken to the appropriate people at Cambridge College
