Spanish-language features of Cambridge College Online Library

Spanish-Language Database in CCOL

The Oceano Universitas is a Spanish-language database in the CCOL.

Océano Universitas has at its disposal information from over 191,000 articles in Spanish and 40,000 graphics and images with specific content from the Spanish-speaking countries.

To search this database:

- Log into CCOL from MyCC
- From the Home page, click *Direct to Databases*
- On the resulting page, click *Oceano Universitas*

Note: for technical reasons, the Oceano database is not included in any of the “Search here for...” search boxes in CCOL. They can only be searched directly from the “Direct to Databases” page.

Translation Tools in CCOL
