Journal, document, book, and periodicals in CCOL

On the CCOL HOME page, the *Search here for Education* search box will search these databases:

If you want medical information, please use the *Search for All Subjects* search box to search all of the above databases plus these additional databases:

- CINAHL with Full Text for 600 journals (this is a nursing database)
- Lexi-Pals Drug Guide
- MEDLINE with Full Text for 1370 journals and indexes everything medical
- Mental Measurements Yearbook/ Tests in Print from Buros Institute

For the *Journal of School Nursing*, which is not searched by any of the CCOL search boxes: from the CCOL HOME page click *Direct to Databases*, then click *Journal of School Nursing*.

Research Starters in Education

“Research Starters are study and research guides...They consist of comprehensive, yet concise topic summary articles of about 3,000 words in length written by researchers, scholars and other subject matter experts.” Use the Research Starters to explore topics and get your research started.

- On the CCOL HOME page, click *Direct to Databases*
- Click *EBSCOHost*
- Click *Databases A-Z*
- Scroll down and click on the title *Research Starters in Education*
- Put a term in the search box and click Search. For example:
 - 161 articles for “School AND Health”
 - 252 articles for “health AND education”
 - 7 articles for “school AND wellness”
 - 20 articles for “sex education”
 - 6 articles for “violence prevention”
 - 29 articles for “mental health AND school”

Ebrary Electronic Books in CCOL

To search for health/family and consumer services books in the Ebrary Electronic Books collection:

- From the CCOL HOME page, click Direct to Databases
- Click Ebrary Electronic Books
- Click Advanced (to the right of the “Search Ebrary” box)
- Use the drop-down menu of the “Search in” box to search by subject (or title, author, etc.)
- For example, searches found
 - 71 books on “Children AND health”
 - 235 books on school and violence
 - 15 books on sleep
 - 17 books on immunization
 - 11 on obesity and children

Some of the books are

- Be sure to search it for your subject area!
- Click “Advanced Book Search” and check “Full View Only” to limit the search to full-text results
- “PartialView” can also provide plenty of full-text

<http://www.amazon.com> or <http://www.bn.com> Use these easy search engine to get lists of books on your topic and to read excerpts, but try to get the books from your local library or buy from your local independent bookstore. Or, buy a less expensive used copy from an online independent bookstore at <http://www.bookfinder.com>

Who would care about this topic?

Where would they publish what they know?
