Admission requirements: Bachelor's degree and other general requirements (see Admission).

Hybrid/blended education format: Each 3-credit course provides at least 32 contact hours in class, plus 8 hours distance education with the faculty instructor online; total 40 hours per course.

All academic programs are under review and may change in 2011.
