



Cambridge College is providing accreditation and certification information to you in order to clarify the degree-granting relationship between Cambridge College and the Puerto Rico Council of Higher Education.

Cambridge College is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. through its Commission on Institutions of Higher Education. The Massachusetts Department of Higher Education approved the degree programs offered by Cambridge College (Doctor of Education, Master of Education, Master of Management, Bachelor of Arts, and Bachelor of Science). The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education approved the Master of Education programs leading to licensure in Massachusetts and reviews those programs on a cyclical basis.

The Master of Education program with a concentration in Marriage and Family Counseling is a non-licensure track program. Students planning to practice as a Marriage and Family Therapist in another state should check with the Board of Registration of the state in which they wish to practice to determine coursework required by that state.

Additionally, on September 8, 2010, The Puerto Rico Council on Higher Education (PRCHE) certified that the Renewal License of the Cambridge College, Puerto Rico Regional Center, conferred by the means of Certification Number 2005-112, is still valid to operate as a higher education institution in Puerto Rico.

Through these accreditation and approval processes, students receive degrees in their home states and Puerto Rico following successful program completion at Cambridge College Regional Centers. Puerto Rico residents who graduate from Master of Education programs in Puerto Rico may receive educator licenses from the Puerto Rico Council of Higher Education upon completion of all specified licensure requirements.
