Cambridge College Leads New England in Granting Master's Degrees to Hispanics

***Hispanic Outlook's* annual "Top 100 Colleges for Hispanics" ranks the school #47 nationally**

CAMBRIDGE, MASS., June 15, 2010 – Cambridge College, a private non-profit college serving a diverse population of working adults, awarded more master's degrees to Hispanic students than any other college or university in New England during the 2009 academic year. Nationally, the school ranked 47th, according to the annual list "Top 100 Colleges for Hispanics" in *The Hispanic Outlook in Higher Education* magazine.

"We serve a rich variety of students in terms of age, race, and life experiences. Their dedication and success are the spirit of the Cambridge College community," said Dr. Tito Guerrero, III, Cambridge College president. "This distinction highlights our mission of providing educational opportunities to working adults who may otherwise have limited access to a quality higher education."

Hispanic students earned 148, or 11.5%, of the school's 1,290 master's degrees in 2009. Cambridge College offers a comprehensive assortment of degree and non-degree options tailored to the needs of adult learners. Besides master's-level study across three schools: the School of Education; the School of Psychology and Counseling; and the School of Management,

degree offerings include undergraduate, doctoral, and certificate programs. In addition to the main campus at 1000 Massachusetts Avenue between Harvard and Central Square, the college has seven regional centers nationwide, including Springfield and Lawrence, Massachusetts.
